Dear Member,

You may have seen in the media that (despite a big petition) from 2012 Barnet Council are increasing rents threefold for Barnet residents and six fold for out-ofborough plot holders. Yes, you read that correctly! This is a serious threat to our future. However there are questions as to the legality of such increases (which are being followed-up) and, more importantly, the Council has a hidden agenda in that it is trying to persuade allotment associations to assume self-management of their sites - in which event those associations would set their own rents. Allotment associations in the borough have jointly asked the Council to negotiate urgently with Barnet Federation of Allotments to devise a scheme of selfmanagement that is fair and reasonable and will work well for all parties.

The committee can also co-opt members for one-off purposes or members with special skills: for example to form a sub-committee to fight rent increases and look at the selfmanagement issue. You might not want to be an Officer or committee member but might want to get involved in these other two important issues.

Free composted green waste that we have delivered at roughly two-monthly intervals is extremely popular but members who work during the week rarely get a look in. We cannot find a simple way of providing fair shares for all. **Any suggestions.**

Bonfires are only permitted between November and April, in October after 4pm, and on the first Wednesday of July, August and September. Every year some members forget these rules - they cause problems with our neighbours and provoke complaints to the Council. This is a political issue that could lead to a total ban.

Skips: We only get two skips a year for our whole site. Therefore we ask you to take rubbish away with you and put it in your bin at home, if possible. Please do not put anything that can be burnt or composted in our skip: it is for glass, plastic, mineral waste and similar. We are also managing to clear metal waste by separate means.

Security: There have been a number of break-ins to our site recently: frankly there is not a lot more that we can do about this. Please report any losses to the police. Do not leave valuable equipment on site and mark tools with your home postcode. Lock site gates when you come and go.

Plot Cleanliness: Please do not let weeds become a nuisance to your neighbours, and let us know promptly if you are giving up your plot: we have a long waiting list for plots. It is your responsibility to keep paths clear, level, mown and <u>at least</u> 18" (1/2 metre) wide. Main paths adjoining your plot need to be mown too. Trees planted on plots can become a nuisance to other plot holders: if you have them it is your duty to prune them.

Trading Hut: We would like to sell more vegetable plants in the trading hut. Some were grown for us last year but we would welcome offers from other people to do this.

The trading hut is open from 2.30 - 4.00 on Saturday afternoons and from 10.30 - Noon on Sunday mornings. We have added some new items to our seed range including a selection of unusual radishes; Crown Prince Squash; Chinese Gooseberry; Celtuce and red Brussel Sprouts. We have a selection of tomato seeds that show some blight resistance.

Urgently Needed: We urgently need some extra people to man the Trading Hut on Saturday afternoons, and people to maintain garden machinery on a regular basis.

We had a particularly good growing season last summer with little tomato blight until quite late. However many people's potato crops were destroyed by freak flooding and frost early on.

We wish you success with whatever you plant. Our allotments are a precious and threatened resource, so please join us in taking care of them and helping in any way you can.
